Player of the Week

Princeton senior **Tim Lahey** (Worcester, Mass.) batted .500 in four games during the week to lift his average by 53 points. On Saturday against Columbia, he set a Princeton record for home runs in a game as he belted three of them in the second game of the doubleheader. It was a huge week altogether for Lahey. He went a combined 8-for-16 with nine RBIs, seven runs scored, four home runs, two doubles and five walks.

Pitcher of the Week

Dartmouth senior **Tim Grant** (Vancouver, British Columbia) tossed complete game victories against Cornell and Brown to improve his Ivy record to 3-0. Grant gave up just one run and four hits while striking out six in Dartmouth's 8-1 win over Cornell. With the Big Green tied in the standings with division-rival Brown Sunday, Grant allowed two runs on five hits with five strikeouts in a 4-2 win over the Bears. Grant moved to 4-2 for the year and lowered his ERA to 4.61.

Rookie of the Week

Yale freshman first baseman **Marc Sawyer** (Largo, Fla.) went 9-for-15 (.600) with three RBI, two doubles and 11 total bases in two doubleheaders against Harvard. Sawyer, who leads the Bulldogs with a .398 batting average, has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games, going 18-for-39 (.462) during that stretch.

Ivy Honor Roll

Penn's **Alex Blagojevich** (Tampa, Fla.) finished the week with a .320 average, collecting eight hits, including one double and the grand slam for six RBI on the week.

In the four game series versus Princeton, Columbia's **Steve Compton** (Springfield, Pa.) hit .667 (10-of-15) with two doubles, two home runs and six RBI. He finished the series with a 1.200 slugging percentage and a .722 on-base percentage.

In game one on Sunday at Columbia, Princeton freshman **Gavin Fabian** (Mission Viejo, Calif.) surrendered just one run on five hits while throwing just 81 pitches. His performance lowered his ERA to 2.52 and in 50 innings of work, he has just two walks.

Dartmouth senior **Ed Lucas** (Deltona, Fla.) hit .12-for-23 (.522) with seven runs scored and six RBI, and had a .607 on base percentage to pace Dartmouth to a 5-1 record in Ivy games. Against Cornell, he went 6-for-9 with a home run, double, four runs scored and five RBI in a doubleheader sweep. Saturday against Brown, Lucas went 5-for-9 with a run and an RBI.

Cornell sophomore C/1B **William Pauly** (Atlantic Beach, Fla.) drove in the winning run versus Le Moyne with a double, giving the Red its first win over the Dolphins in 13 games. In seven games last week, he led team with 14 total bases, a .519 slugging percentage, a .400 on base percentage, and was second on the team overall with his .324 batting average.

Harvard sophomore OF/RHP **Lance Salsgiver** (Davison, Mich.) came in relief of Trey Hendricks on Sunday and tossed three innings of two-hit ball as the Crimson took the final game with Yale. Salsgiver faced 12 batters, striking out six and walking just two.

Yale sophomore **Alec Smith** (Turlock, Calif.) allowed one run and four hits in a seven inning, complete game victory over Harvard last Saturday. Smith, who earned his team-leading fifth win and lowered his ERA to 2.51 on the season, has allowed three earned runs over his last 21.2 innings and has won his last three conference decisions.

In six League games, Brown freshman 1B/LF **Devin Thomas** (Gainesville, Fla.) drove in a team-high 13 runs, including a three in a walk-off homerun in the Bears thrilling 4-2 victory over Dartmouth. He went 8-25 at the plate for a .320 average with four doubles and four runs scored.

- Brown Bears -

The Bears went 3-3 on the week with all six games coming in League play ... After sweeping Penn in a two-game series the Bears dropped three-of-four games to Dartmouth in their Red Rolfe Division opener ... Senior **Bobby Deeb** (West St. Paul, Minn.) broke the Brown all-time hits record in the Bears sweep over Penn on Thursday ... He tallied the record-setting 209th hit of his career in the opening frame of game one ... Freshman **Devin Thomas** (Gainesville, Fla.) drove in a team-high 13 runs, including a three-run walk-off home run in the Bears thrilling 4-2 victory over Dartmouth in game one of the series ... Junior **Bobby Wiginton** (Fresno, Calif.) led the team going 11-19 at the plate for a .579 average ... Junior **Jeff Nichols** (Medford, N.J.) had a breakout week, going 9-18 at the plate ... In the Penn series, Nichols reached base in all 11 of his plate appearances ... He also drove in the game-tying runs in the win over the Big Green ... Sophomore **Paul Christian** (Chapel Hill, N.C.) continued his power hitting, tallying his seventh and eighth homers of the season ... He is currently tied for the League lead in home runs ... Christian also leads the League with 33 runs this season ... Sophomore **Danny Hughes** (Andover, Mass.) is second in the League with 31 RBI ... He knocked in six runs in game one against the Quakers as he sent two over the fence, his third and fourth home runs of the season ... Senior **Sam Jennings** (New Ashford, Mass.) pitched a stellar outing in Brown's lone win of the Dartmouth series ... In 7 innings, Jennings allowed the League's number one hitting team just four hits and one unearned run ... He cruised through four straight hitless and six straight scoreless innings in the 4-2 extra innings win ... Brown will take a break from League action during the week as it travels to Maine on Tuesday for one game ... The Bears will then play a doubleheader with Marist at Dodd Stadium in Norwich, Conn. home of the San Francisco Giants' AA affiliate, the Norwich Navigators ... Brown then gets back to Red Rolfe Division action over the weekend with a four-game series at Harvard.

- Columbia Lions -

Columbia dropped four games to Princeton last weekend ... The Lions totaled 37 hits over the weekend, with senior **Steve Compton** (Springfield, Pa.) leading the way ... Sophomore **Marc Gold** (Melville, N.Y.) totaled four hits in two games started and tied game one with an RBI single in the bottom of the seventh ... Senior **Jorge Livermore** (Miami, Fla.) totaled four RBI on the weekend ... Columbia closes out conference play this weekend versus Cornell.

- Cornell Big Red -

Cornell's trip to Penn marked the first time ever since the teams first met in a four-game series back in 1993 that the Big Red has claimed at least three games in the annual series ... During that time, the best the Red has done is a 2-2 split. (Prior to the 1993 season, it was the EIBL and Cornell faced it's Ivy opponents just twice during the season.) ... Cornell's win over Le Moyne snapped a nine-game skid this season and was the first win over the Dolphins in 13 games, dating back to the last win in the 1997 season ... **William Pauly** (Atlantic Beach, Florida) drove in the winning run versus Le Moyne, with a two-out double down the leftfield line ... **Matt Miller** (Gaithersburg, Md.) and **Jon Finch** (Trumansburg, N.Y.) helped earn two of the wins over Penn, driving in the winning runs in games three and four, respectively ...

Miller singled through the right side to bring in **Josh Foster** (Lake Oswego, Ore.), while Finch singled in **Ned Van Allan** (Rochester, N.Y.) ... Cornell's winning run in game two of the series was scored by **David Bredhoff** (Penfield, N.Y.), who crossed the plate on an error ... In seven games last week, 10 different players had extra-base hits ... Van Allan led the way with five on four doubles and a home run ... Overall, the team had 15 doubles and four homers ... Outfielder **Kaleb Hutchinson** (Vancouver, Wash.) led the Big Red rookies for the week, going 8-for-27 (.296) with 3 RBI, 5 runs, a double and a home run ... **Luke Staskal** (Mt. Vernon, Iowa) earned the complete game win in the second game of the Penn series ... He had five strikeouts and gave up two runs on just four hits ... He was the only Big Red pitcher to not give up an extra base hit on the week and led with his five Ks ... **Dan Gala** (Moraga, Calif.) earned the complete game win over Penn in the final game of the series ... He threw nine innings, struck out three, walked one and gave up just one run on 10 hits ... He also threw three innings of relief in the second game versus Dartmouth ... In that game, he had two strikeouts ... **Tad Bardenwerper** (Bethesda, Md.) claimed victory over the Quakers as well, with five innings of action in the third game ... **Trevor Vieweg** (Encinitas, Calif.) also earned a win on the mound against Le Moyne ... He threw the first five innings and gave up three runs ... Cornell faces Le Moyne in a doubleheader on Wednesday and then plays host to Columbia in a four-game series over the weekend ... Le Moyne leads the all-time series with the Big Red, 23-9 ... The two first met in 1964 ... Cornell and Columbia first met during the 1885 season and the Big Red holds a 104-80 advantage in the all-time series ... Last year in NYC, Cornell took three of the four games.

- Dartmouth Big Green -

At 17-10 overall, Dartmouth has matched the win total of last year's team with 13 games to go ... The 2003 Big Green went 17-19 overall ... Dartmouth is also just one Ivy win short of the matching last year's total of 10 ... The Big Green, now 9-3 in the Ivy League, went 10-10 last year ... Going back to last season, Dartmouth is on an impressive run in Ivy games ... The Big Green won eight of its last 12 contests last year and have won nine of the first 12 this year to take 17 of the last 24 overall ... With nine of the 13 remaining games at Red Rolfe Field, there will be a record watch going on at Dartmouth home games ... Senior **Scott Shirrell** (Portland, Maine) is primed to leave as one of the most accomplished players in Big Green history ... Shirrell has already broken the runs record with a total of 161 in his career ... He is quickly approaching records in hits and doubles ... With 202 hits, Shirrell stands 11 behind Brian Nickerson '01 ... Shirrell's 46 doubles are two behind Nickerson's 48 ... He also has a shot at the RBI record, as his 139 RBI are currently 11 off the mark set by Aaron Meyer '00 ... Shirrell's name also shows up in the top ten of home runs and triples ... While Shirrell is setting marks for his career, senior **Ed Lucas** (Deltona, Fla.) is on pace for one of the best single seasons in Dartmouth baseball ... Lucas' .477 batting average leads the nation and is on pace to be the best in one season at Dartmouth ... With 13 games to go, Lucas is 22 hits off the single season mark, 19 runs short and seven doubles off the one year best ... Lucas leads the Ivy League in batting average, hits, on base percentage, doubles and runs scored ... He is second in total bases and third in slugging percentage ... Junior **Jeff Speights** (San Diego, Calif.) tops the conference with 36 RBI and classmate **Josh Bailey** (Lexington, Ky.) is tops with 24 walks ...

As a team, the Big Green leads the Ivy League with a .313 batting average ... The Big Green has a staff ERA of 5.42, good for third in the Ivy League ... Sophomore **Josh Faiola** (Pueblo, Colo.) and senior **Tim Grant** (Vancouver, British Columbia) are both 3-0 in Ivy games and Faiola is fourth in the conference with a 2.89 ERA ... Freshman **Stephen Perry** (Milford, N.H.) is 2-0, and the Big Green is a perfect 9-0 in Ivy games started by Faiola, Grant, and Perry ... Dartmouth's other starter, senior **Pat Dowling** (Holyoke, Mass.), threw six scoreless innings in a loss to Brown Saturday ... Dartmouth, atop the Red Rolfe standings at 9-3, faces a crucial four-game home weekend against Yale after mid-week contests against Vermont and Holy Cross ... Dartmouth won three-of-four at Yale last year, putting up 46 runs in the four games.

- Harvard Crimson -

The Crimson dropped three of four to Yale over the weekend and now sit at 8-4 in League action, one game behind Dartmouth for the Division lead ... **Josh Klimkiewicz** (Lexington, Mass.) blasted Harvard's lone home run of the week upping the Crimson total to 23 for the season ... **Javier Castellanos** (Hialeah, Fla.) pitched eight innings of effective ball in the 3-2 loss to Boston College on Friday, giving up just three earned runs ... Harvard swiped 13 of 17 bases, including two each from **Morgan Brown** (Alstead, N.H.), **Schuyler Mann** (Corvallis, Mont.), **Chris Mackey** (Somerville, Mass.) and **Lance Salsgiver** (Davison, Mich.) ... Only Columbia (59) and Brown (50) have more stolen bases than Harvard (44) ... Salsgiver's nine are third most in the League ... Salsgiver is not only a threat on the basepaths but on the mound as well ... He went three innings of relief in the win over Yale yielding only two hits ... Senior **Jason Brown** (Aqua Dulce, Calif.) has pitched some scoreless relief over the weekend, holding Yale without a run and to only one hit in 2.2 innings ... **Trey Hendricks** (Houston, Texas) registered his fifth straight win on Sunday ... His five victories lead the League ... **Zak Farkes** (Boston, Mass.) has scored a team-leading 31 runs this season, good for third in the Ivies ... He has 71 for his career ... His seven home runs this season rank him second in the League ... With the Red Sox doing maintenance work on their field at Fenway Park, the 15th Annual Beanpot has been moved to Campanelli Stadium, home of the minor league Brockton Rox ... The Crimson will get a shot at revenge when it faces Boston College in game two of the doubleheader ... That game is scheduled for 8 p.m. ... Harvard will then play another game there on Wednesday before hosting Brown for a pivotal four game set this weekend.

- Penn Quakers -

Penn collected 24 hits and 14 runs against Brown ... **Alex Blagojevich** (Tampa, Fla.) went 5-for-10 at the plate, knocking in six runs ... Blagojevich belted a two-out grand slam home run on a 1-1 pitch in the bottom of the fifth inning of game one on Thursday ... The Bears swept the two games from Penn, 14-7 and 15-7 ... Penn's six-game losing skid ended with a dramatic 3-2 victory over Cornell in game one of Saturday's doubleheader ... The game was settled in the bottom of the 10th inning when **Ken-Ichi Hino** (Washington, D.C.) scored on a wild pitch ... **Nate Moffie** (Wallingford, Conn.) belted a two-run home run with one gone in the ninth to extend the game ... The Quakers surrendered a three-run lead in the top of the sixth inning of game one to drop the contest, 6-4, to Cornell on Senior Day ... The Big Red completed the Sunday sweep with a 5-1 victory over the Red and Blue to take three-out-of-four during the weekend ... The Red and Blue inducted five new members into the Penn Baseball Hall of Fame last weekend.

- Princeton Tigers -

Princeton went 4-1 over the week dropping a midweek contest at Rutgers before taking four games from Columbia over the weekend ... The sweep vaulted the Tigers to the top of the Gehrig Division standings and Princeton is now two games back of Dartmouth in the race for the home-field advantage in the Ivy League Championship Series ... Despite a loss Thursday at Rutgers, it allowed the Tiger bats to wake up which boded well for the weekend as Princeton outscored the Lions 44-23 over the four games ... Saturday was a record-setting day at Columbia for the Tigers as Princeton scored a combined 33 runs, setting a new team record for runs in a doubleheader ... The previous record was 30 and was accomplished three times, twice against Columbia and once against Texas A&M-Kingsville ... The Princeton record for home runs in a game also fell on Saturday as **Tim Lahey** (Worcester, Mass.) belted three of them in the second game ... The previous record was two in a game and had been accomplished 22 times, most recently by **Ryan Reich** (Ocean City, N.J.) last season against Dartmouth ... It was a huge week altogether for Lahey ... He went a combined 8-for-16 with nine RBIs, seven runs scored, four home runs, two doubles and five walks ... In game one, **Gavin Fabian** (Mission Viejo, Calif.) needed just 81 pitched to dispose of Columbia ... He surrendered just one run on five hits as he improved to 3-2 on the season ... Princeton plays twice this week before hosting Penn for a pair of doubleheaders this weekend ... Tuesday the Tigers host Monmouth and Wednesday they visit Seton Hall.

- Yale Bulldogs -

Yale (13-15, 8-4) took three-of-four games from archrival Harvard last weekend and now are tied with the Crimson for second place in the Red Rolfe division, one game behind Dartmouth (9-3) ... The Bulldogs will play at Dartmouth this weekend ... **Marc Sawyer** (Largo, Fla.) went 9-for-15 (.600) last weekend to raise his team-leading batting average to .398 ... Sawyer, who ranks fourth in the conference in batting, has now hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games, going 18-for-39 during that stretch ... **Matt Stone** (Irvine, Calif.) went 7-for-15 (.467) over the weekend with seven RBI, which included a key three-run double in game two on Saturday and raised his batting average 46 points over the four games to .317 ... Team captain **Randy Leonard** (Pembroke Pines, Fla.) went 5-for-10 on the weekend ... Bulldog starters **Alec Smith** (Turlock, Calif.), **Josh Sowers** (Louisville, Ky.) and **Jon Hollis** (Jacksonville, Fla.) all picked up wins against Harvard ... Smith threw a four-hitter in a complete-game performance to earn his team-leading fifth win ... Smith has only allowed three earned runs in his last 21.2 innings and has a 3-0 record over his last three conference starts ... Sowers (3-2) retired 13 of his 14 batters in a complete game, seven inning win on Sunday and owns a 2.06 ERA which leads the Ivy League and ranks 35th in the nation ... Hollis (3-2) went 7.1 innings and gave up four hits, all singles, and struck out eight in a victory in game two on Saturday ... Yale continues to lead the Ivy League in pitching with a 4.06 ERA and team fielding (.967).
