Player of the Week

Yale junior center **Dominick Martin** (Asheville, N.C.) averaged 17 points and 12 rebounds as Yale swept Cornell and Columbia. Against Cornell, Martin was 7-of-12 from the field and scored 15 points in 27 minutes. He also grabbed 12 rebounds and had two assists. Against Columbia, Martin was 7-of-11 from the field and had 19 points. He also grabbed 12 rebounds and added two blocks and two steals. Nine of Martin's 12 rebounds came in the second half as Yale outrebounded Columbia 16-13 after being outrebounded 24-14 in the first half. In the two games, Martin shot 60.9 percent (14-of-23) and was 6-of-8 from the foul line.

Rookie of the Week

Penn freshman **David Whitehurst** (Tinton Falls, N.J.) scored a career-best 16 points on 4-for-5 shooting from beyond the arc against Harvard on March 5. He was 5-for-6 from the field with seven rebounds and three assists in just 26 minutes of action. The rookie had five points and two rebounds against Dartmouth the night before. Penn heads into the final regular season game of the year with a 19-8 overall record and 12-1 in the Ancient Eight.

Ivy Honor Roll

Columbia freshman forward **John Baumann** (Wesport, Conn.) continued his tear with his fifth and sixth consecutive double-digit scoring efforts vs. Brown and Yale. Against Brown, the 6-9 rookie totaled 16 points on 6-of-12 shooting, while also grabbing four rebounds in 27 minutes of action. In the Yale game, he came off the bench to score 12 points on 4-of-8 shooting with nine rebounds. Baumann is shooting over 50 percent from the field for the year.

Brown senior guard **Jason Forte** (Rockville, Md.) helped the Bears to a split with Columbia and Cornell, scoring 20 points against both teams. Forte, who has now scored 20 or more points in four straight games, also connected on 13-of-16 free throws for the weekend. He had nine steals in the two games and became Brown's all-time career steal leader with 191 career steals.

Brown freshman guard **Damon Huffman** (Potosky, Mich.) scored a career high 17 points against Columbia, connecting on 5-of-7 shots from behind the three-point arc. He also had two assists and three steals in the victory over the Lions. Against Cornell, Huffman connected on 3-of-7 treys while scoring nine points, adding two assists and a steal.

Dartmouth junior **Mike Lang** (Chicago, Ill.) scored a combined 17 points and pulled down six rebounds at Penn and Princeton. More importantly, he was 2-of-3 from the free throw line, going 48-50 on the year. His 96.0 season effort set a Dartmouth record, breaking the mark of 95.0 percent set by Gus Broberg during 1939-40.

Harvard junior forward **Matt Stehle** (Newton, Mass.) scored 14 points and had nine rebounds, three assists and two steals in Harvard's 66-44 loss to Princeton Friday. He had eight points, five boards and three steals in an 85-68 loss to Penn. Stehle reached double figures in scoring in 23 of the Crimson's 27 games this season and had nine double-doubles.

Cornell senior center **Eric Taylor** (Latham, N.Y.) averaged 15 points, seven rebounds and hit on .813 of his shots on the week (13-of-16). Taylor shot 8-of-10 from the floor to score 16 points and grab 11 rebounds as Cornell captured second place with a victory over Brown. Taylor became the school's 20th 1,000-point scorer, moved into the school's top 10 all-time in rebounding and clinched the career field goal percentage record. He scored 12 of his 16 points after halftime as the Big Red swept the Bears for the first time in six years. The day before, Taylor hit on 5-of-6 field goals to score a team-high 14 points in just 17 minutes of action in a loss to Yale.

Princeton senior guard **Will Venable** (San Rafael, Calif.) had a big weekend for the Tigers, pulling within one point of becoming Princeton's 26th 1,000-point scorer. He had 13 points, seven assists and three rebounds in Princeton's 22-point win over Harvard Friday night. Then, on Saturday, Venable shot 7-for-9 from the field, scored 19 points and added five rebounds and four assists as the Tigers pulled away from Dartmouth. He scored 12 of his 19 points in the second half.

Penn sophomore **Mark Zoller** (Blue Bell, Pa.) led the Quakers in scoring and rebounding in both games last week, scoring 14 points and grabbing nine rebounds against Dartmouth and scoring 19 points and collecting 12 boards versus Harvard. Zoller went 6-for-6 from the field and 2-for-2 from the line in Penn's 64-37 win over the Big Green. Against the Crimson, he was 6-of-8 from the floor in just 19 minutes of action.

Season Finale

The Ivy League regular season wraps up Tuesday night with Yale visiting Brown at 7 p.m. and Penn traveling Princeton for a 7:30 p.m. tip. The Quakers have already claimed the Ivy League regular-season crown and the League's automatic NCAA Tournament berth. Yale can claim a share of second-place with Cornell with a victory over the Bears.

Penn-Princeton, Rnd. 2

Earlier this season at The Palestra, Penn rallied from an 18-point second half deficit to defeat Princeton, 70-62, in overtime. The Quakers were led by Tim Begley's 20 points and Eric Osmundson's 11 second-half points. Penn took the lead for the first time all night on a trey from Jan Fikiel with 3:38 remaining in overtime. Princeton's Judson Wallace nailed the second of two free throws with 7:35 remaining in regulation to give the visiting Tigers their largest lead of the game at 53-35, but Penn went on a 21-3 run to tie the game at 56-56 with 31 ticks left on the clock. Osmundson sparked the Quakers comeback, scoring nine of his 13 points during that stretch, including completing a four-point play when he was fouled on a three, before sinking two free throws to tie the game.

Yale-Brown Face Off

In their first game this season, Brown junior Luke Ruscoe scored a team high 15 points, including nine in the last 4:42, to lift the Bears to a 70-64 win. Brown outscored Yale 14-7 over the final minutes for its fifth straight win over the Bulldogs.

Penn Set To Dance

The Quakers will find out their first round opponent and destination this Sunday at 6 p.m. with CBS' telecast of Selection Sunday. Penn has information on tickets at pennathletics.com.

Quite An Improvement

Dartmouth finished the year with a 10-17 overall record, 7-7 in the Ivy League. The Big Green is guaranteed at least a tie for fourth place in the Ancient Eight standings, after finishing last a year ago at 1-13. With six more conference wins this season, Dartmouth enjoyed a tie for the second-best improvement in Ivy League history. Columbia also enjoyed a six-game improvement last season.

Top-to-Bottom

The League was especially strong from top-to-bottom this season as all eight Ivy schools finished with at least 10 regular season wins for the first time in formal Ivy League history.
