Team-by-Team Notes

BROWN

Junior guard **Courtney Lee** swiped 10 steals in Brown's losses to Cornell and Columbia to continue to pace the Ivy League in that category at 2.7 per game. Lee also netted a career-high 17 points, 12 rebounds and four assists against Cornell. Her 2.7 steals per game rank 38th in the NCAA.

COLUMBIA

Sophomore forward **Judie Lomax** currently leads the nation at 13.9 rebounds per game and sits in fourth in the conference in scoring at 14.0 points per game. Entering the Lions' home matchup with Penn, Her single-season total of 250 rebounds currently sits in fourth place on the all-time single season rebounding list at Columbia.

CORNELL

Cornell's game against Penn will be part of the NCAA's Pack the House Challenge. The event allows NCAA member schools to compete against schools in their own conference, as well as all Division I schools, for a chance to win prizes by setting an attendance record. Senior forward **Shannan Scarselletta** is currently in eighth place in Cornell history with 56 career blocks and needs just seven more blocks to surpass **Heidi Johnson** (1982-86), who sits in seventh place with 62 career blocks.

DARTMOUTH

Dartmouth earned its 500th victory in program history with its 71-67 overtime win at Princeton before giving head coach **Chris Wielgus** her 200th Ivy League win (390th overall) with a 56-39 triumph at Penn. On the weekend, Dartmouth shot 44 percent from the field and 56 percent from three-point range. Defense continued to be Dartmouth's calling card, holding Princeton to 52 points in regulation and Penn to just 39 for the game. The Big Green is getting its scoring from a variety of sources, with four players in double-figures at Princeton led by the emerging sophomore guard **Meghan McFee**. Making just her fourth collegiate start, McFee poured in 21 points to lead the Big Green to the overtime win.

HARVARD

Three Harvard players scored in double figures in a 72-63 win over Penn to give Harvard its 500th win in program history. Sophomore guard **Christine Matera** scored a career-high 17 points against the Quakers, which included a 5-for-5 effort from the three-point line on her 20th birthday. Against Princeton, Matera was one of four players in double figures, going 4-for-5 from beyond the arc. Sophomore forward **Emma Markley** recorded her fourth double-double of the season, with a team-high 22 points in an 82-73 win over Princeton. The Crimson's game against Yale is its its first televised game since playing Maryland on ESPN in the first round of the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

PENN

Penn's game at Columbia will mark the first time the Quakers will play on the road since its game at Rider on January 13 -- a span of 24 days. The overnight trip to Cornell on February will be the first time since December 7 at Colgate in which the Quakers spent a night away from home - exactly two months ago. Sophomore forward **Jerin Smith** is coming off a six-day span in which she broke her career-high point total two times and nearly set a personal best in rebounding—all while coming off the bench. Her 12 points vs. Seton Hall were a career-best until she topped that with 13 points against Dartmouth. Smith also had six rebounds, one off her collegiate-best vs. Seton Hall.

PRINCETON

Sophomore guard/forward **Addie Micir** had career night in a hard-fought 82-73 loss against Harvard. She recorded a career-high 24 points, 15 of which came from behind the three-point arc, helping Princeton overcome a 19-point deficit to cut the lead to three in the final minute of the game. With its weekend series at Cornell and Columbia, the Tigers will be looking to end winless streaks of four-straight against the Big Red and three-straight against the Lions. Princeton leads the all-time series in both -- 36-20 against Cornell and 32-14 against Columbia.

YALE

With its win over Columbia, Yale recorded its ninth win of the season, matching its 2007-08 win total. Junior forward **Melissa Colborne** netted 21 points in two games last week, slotting her just 11 points away from claiming sole possession of 13th on Yale's all-time scoring list. Earlier this season, Colborne became the seventh Bulldog to reach 1,000 points as a junior. Yale's Friday night contest against Harvard will air live on the YES Network as a part of the Yale on YES series. After this weekend, the Bulldogs will have played the three defending Ivy League co-champions in consecutive games.
