

Team-by-Team **NOTES**

BROWN

With two touchdown passes in the win over Harvard, senior QB **Michael Dougherty** moved into fifth place on Brown's career passing yards list with 3,492 yards and a tie for seventh place with **Pete Kohut** ('52-'54) on Brown's career touchdown passes list with 21. Junior WR **Buddy Farnham** is tied for second in the nation among FCS schools averaging 9.0 receptions per game.

COLUMBIA

Columbia held Towson QB **Sean Schaefer**, the FCS active leader in career passing yards, to just 193 yards through the air in a tough 31-24 road loss. The Columbia-Towson game was delayed for 46 minutes due to lightning. Junior QB **Shane Kelly** is second in total offense (254.0 ypg) and third in passing yards (225.5 ypg) in the Ivy League through the first two games of the season. He leads all Ivy signal-callers with four passing touchdowns.

CORNELL

Cornell has won its two games by a total of four points, the first time it has won that narrowly in consecutive games since winning at Bucknell (29-28) and at home against Dartmouth (17-14) on back-to-back weekends during the 1994 season. The Big Red has posted eight sacks while not allowing one this season. Cornell opponents have fumbled 11 times (five lost) in two games, while the Big Red has not put the ball on the ground once.

DARTMOUTH

The Dartmouth-New Hampshire series is now tied at 17-17-2 with UNH winning the last 11 straight. The Big Green won the first 16 in the series through 1972. Three players completed passes for Dartmouth against New Hampshire. Senior WR **Philip Galligan** sat out the game with an injury a week after catching 10 passes for 146 yards. After the first game, he was leading the nation in all-purpose yards. He is expected to play again against Penn. Junior QB **Alex Jenny** had the first reception of his career, catching a 15-yard pass from sophomore WR **Tim McManus**.

HARVARD

Senior QB **Chris Pizzotti** has thrown in excess of 320 yards in each of his last three games dating back to 2007 ... Harvard has not seen an opposing player rush for more than 100 yards for a stretch of 29 straight games. The last player to break 100 on the ground against Harvard was Brown's **Nick Hartigan**, who had 115 yards on Sept. 24, 2005 ... Harvard's loss on Saturday marked an end to its nine-season streak of winning Ivy League openers as well as an eight-game win streak over Brown ... Harvard has won seven straight games against Lafayette, which enters Saturday's game undefeated at 3-0. The last time Lafayette defeated Harvard came in 1996.

PENN

Franklin Field will celebrate its 800th Penn football game when the Quakers open their 2008 Ivy schedule against Dartmouth on Saturday. Dartmouth has not won on at Franklin Field in 11 years. A loss to the Big Green would give Penn a 0-3 start for the second year in a row. The Quakers have had a rushing touchdown in each of their last six games and in eight of the last nine contests. Senior TE **Josh Koontz** has had a reception in eight straight games. Penn has forced a turnover in 14 straight games dating back to the two-overtime loss at Princeton on Nov. 4, 2006.

PRINCETON

In reserve of injured starter junior LB **John Callahan**, junior LB **Jeff Jackson** had a career effort with nine tackles, including 1.5 for losses, added a sack and an interception in Princeton's 10-7 victory over Lehigh. Sophomore LB **Steve Cody** recorded 10 tackles, marking consecutive games with double-digit tackles to start his career.

YALE

Yale's road win streak ended at 12 games with a loss at Cornell. The Bulldogs had not lost away from the Bowl since Oct. 22, 2005, a 38-21 decision at Penn. Yale suffered its first Ivy opener loss since a 19-7 setback in 2004 at Cornell, the last time the Red had beat the Blue. The Elis have won six of their last eight League openers and are 7-4 under head coach **Jack Siedlecki**. Yale, which had zero net rushing yards at Cornell, suffered five sacks and lost 49 rushing yards just on those plays. That was the lowest rushing output for the Blue since Connecticut held Yale to -8 (65 total offense) in 1984, a 20-0 Huskies win.
