Ivy League Women's Lacrosse All-Ivy Teams Announced

Princeton, N.J. — Six repeat selections, including two three-time and one four-time first-team All-Ivy selections, headline this year's All-Ivy Women's Lacrosse teams in a vote by the League's eight head coaches.

Cornell senior **Jaimee Reynolds** (Baltimore, Md.) was named the Ivy League Player of the Year after she led the Big Red to a 6-1 record, its best finish in school history. Ranked in the top 10 of the national polls throughout the season, Cornell earned a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Reynolds, a three-time first-teamer, was selected as the Ivy League Player of the Week six times, which is a League record. The midfielder led the League in scoring, with 24 goals and six assists in Ivy contests. Reynolds, an unanimous selection to first team, also tied for the first place position in overall scoring, connecting on 44 goals and dishing out 13 assists. Also representing the Big Red on first team is junior **Sarah Averson** (Manlius, N.Y.). Averson was fourth in the League in scoring with 21 points, was the second leading scorer on the Cornell squad, and scored 67 percent of her free position attempts. Goalkeeper **Carrie Giancola** (Manlius, N.Y.) joins Reynolds and Averson to first team. Giancola, a first-team selection last season, played behind the fourth ranked defense in the country with a .504 save percentage in Ivy games and .519 overall.

Princeton topped the list with five first teamers on this year's All-Ivy team. The Tigers claimed its sixth Ivy League title behind the play of seniors **Lauren Simone** (Delran, N.J.), **Charlotte Kenworthy** (Frazer, Pa.) and **Brooke Owens** (Paoli, Pa.), junior **Rachel Becker** (Broomall, Pa.), and sophomore **Theresa Sherry** (Baltimore, Md.). No. 1 in the national polls for most of the season, Princeton earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Simone, an unanimous selection, finished third in the League in scoring, collecting 54 points on 40 goals and 14 assists. Sherry, also voted unanimously to first team, was the second leading scorer on the Tiger squad with 47 points, while Kenworthy was sixth in the League in Ivy scoring. Owens and Becker led a Princeton defense that allowed only 38 goals in Ivy play. Owens totaled 26 draw controls, 27 ground balls and 26 caused turnovers for the season. Becker, the youngest player in 2001 to be honored on first-team All-America, was sixth in the nation with 44 caused turnovers.

Seniors **Jen Newitt** (Radnor, Pa.) and **Katy Cuneo** (Summit, N.J.) represent the Big Green on the first team. Both Newitt and Cuneo were a part of Dartmouth squads that won three straight Ivy titles and tournament appearances from 1999-2001. Newitt, named to the first team in 2001, was an unanimous selection as she tied for the League overall scoring title with 39 goals and 18 assists. Cuneo, Dartmouth's top defender, led the team in ground balls with 41 overall.

Pennsylvania's **Crissy Book** (Coatesville, Pa.), the team's leading with scorer with 33 goals, represents the Quakers on first team. The seventh leading scorer in Ivy contests, Book was a second team All-Ivy selection last season.

Megan Strenski (Moorestown, N.J.) of Yale was named to first team All-Ivy for the fourth time. One of the League's top defenders, Strenski was noted for holding some of the Ivy's best attackers scoreless. Also from the Elis is sophomore **Miles Whitman** (Baltimore, Md.). She ranked first on the Bulldog squad with 39 goals scored and second with 45 total points. Whitman also ranked second in Ivy scoring for the year.

Yale's **Katie Sargent** (Unionville, Pa.) was named the Ivy League Rookie of the Year. Sargent, also selected to second-team All-Ivy, was second on Yale's squad in scoring, tallying a goal in every game she played. She ranked eighth in both overall and Ivy scoring for the year.
